

GUIDELINES FOR RETURNING TO THE BUILDING

Greetings to everyone.

As most of you know, we have been working toward the day when we can return to worship at the church building. The day that has been selected is this coming Sunday, July 5, 2020. We would like to let you know the guidelines that have been set for that return. There are two considerations here:

- 1) The safety and health of everyone
 - 2) Compliance with local laws
1. We will meet at the building for the Sunday morning assembly only.
 - a. All other meetings will continue on Zoom. (Sunday evening, Wednesday evening)
 - b. We will not have Sunday morning class because of the time difficulty for those coming to the building.
 2. Everyone will be ushered to their seats.
 - a. Please go where the usher takes you and sit where you are asked.
 - b. Alternate rows in the auditorium have been taped off, so that social distance (6 feet) can be maintained.
 3. Everyone will be ushered out when the assembly is over.
 - a. Those on the west side will be sent out the front doors
 - b. Those on the east side will be sent out the back door.
 4. You will be handed a personal Communion packet, and a baggie to place it in when Communion is over. There will be trash cans placed for your convenience on the way out.
 5. Everyone will be asked to wear a mask while in the building
 - a. This is something that elders ask you to do, for everyone's safety.
 - b. It is also part of the most recent mandate handed down by the governor.
 - c. Masks will be available for those who do not have one.
 - d. Hand sanitizer will be available at several locations in the building.
 6. Use of restrooms:
 - a. Only one person is allowed in a restroom at a time, unless it is a parent with a small child.
 - b. Areas in restrooms not to be used have been taped off.
 7. Use of kitchen:
 - a. The kitchen has been taped off and will not be used.
 - b. Coffee will not be available.
 8. Please do not go into any area that has been taped off.
 9. Who should come?
 - a. If you are in a high-risk group, please stay at home.
 - b. If you are not feeling well for *any* reason, please stay at home.
 - c. We will continue to have the assembly available on Zoom for those who do not feel comfortable in coming to the building.

We hope that everyone will be understanding about these guidelines and will abide by them for the good of the whole congregation. Prayerfully, things will get back to “normal” soon, but until that time, we must do everything we can to stay safe and healthy.

We love you, and pray that you will remain physically well, more importantly that you remain spiritually well.
